CHILDREN MUST HAVE LICENCE FOR TOY GUNS.

Children as young as four in New Zealand are required to apply for "licences" for toy guns. The scheme was launched at Tahunanui kindergarten in Nelson and is spreading rapidly. Children must answer questions and learn rules before they can play gun games. Card licences must then be carried. "They have to tell us the rules of guns and the first rule is that you never point a gun at anybody," said Helen Durbridge, the head teacher.

Applicants for a licence must say why they want one. Those who say they want to shoot endangered animals are told why this must not be done. Youngsters who want to play cops and robbers are told that New Zealand police are usually unarmed, so shooting is forbidden. New Zealand has a high level of gun ownership because of its rural lifestyle. But a series of mass murders during the past decade, and incidents in which police have shot criminals, have made people more conscious of the dangers.
