YOU HAVE TO BE SLIGHTLY MAD TO START YOUR OWN COMPANY

- My name is Shara. I'm 28 next month. Five years ago I set up Tela <u>Itd</u>, a website company, with my husband Craig O'Connell. We make an excellent team. We are both <u>graphic designers</u> but we have different roles within Tela: I generate new business while Craig is responsible for the technical and design work.
- 2. I've always had a big mouth, I have always preferred sales jobs as they seemed to offer the best wages but also a sense of challenge. Software, windows, mobile phones, house insurance, you name it, I sell it. On completion of my degree I knew my skills in sales could not go to waste, so *Tela* was born.
- 3. We started *Tela* with £3,000 borrowed from parents to buy our first Apple Macintosh computer, and we have been self-financing since. Starting off was hard. The banks refused to help us. I was very lucky to have so much support from my family, especially my parents. We started *Tela* from home and after two years moved into premises on the University of East London's Docklands campus.
- 4. So we are a website company, but what makes us different from all the others? Quality comes first; excellent products sell themselves. Winning awards has been brilliant for us (we've won 12 so far). I work 12 hours a day and attend networking meetings. Our staff are also very committed and we are committed to them. All of our employees get a company pension, free gym membership and they're getting healthcare. Customers want a website that's going to make them money or save them money. Who better to come to than innovative designers who love their jobs?
- 5. However you have to be slightly mad to start your own company, working long hours and getting paid next to nothing to begin with. I think I would find it hard to work for someone else now, I like to do it my way. Working for an employer would only restrain my creative capabilities. Design agencies tend to be a bit chaotic; we have a huge open-plan office here and we bellow to each other across it.
- 6. Turnover in our first year was £25,000. This year we'll hit £1 million and have a huge party. I can't imagine giving up work completely, but it would be nice to get to the stage where you don't have to work. Maybe in my 30s!
