## MOUTAIN OF GARBAGE

After years of assaults by thousands of climbers on its peaks, the « roof of the world » was starting to look more like its trash bin. Litterally tons of articles : everything from oxygen cylinders to empty cans to abandoned tents littered the slopes of the world's highest peak, Mount Everest.

After four years of cleanup, limited to two months due to the harsh conditions on the 8,848-meter mountain, alpinist Ken Noguchi, 29, and other climbers from six nations have succeeded in removing 7,7 tons of trash.

The group spent May and June of the last four years cleaning the paths and campsites on the China and Nepal sides. In all they removed an astonishing 423 empty oxygen tanks, mountaineering wear, food packets, playing cards and torn-up letters.

The number of climbers attempting to scale Mount Everest has steadily increased over the years. According to Noguchi, more than 1,000 climbers reached the summit between 1990 and 2002. During the two-month climbing season this year, more than 800 people from 25 expeditions worldwide have passed through the base camp on the Nepalese side. « They even lined up to wait their turn to scale the peak. It's no longer simply about getting to the summit, » Noguchi said. « Nowadays, we need to think about the environmental impact of climbing a moutain. »

Brought to Japan, the trash will be put on display at several sites nationwide to promote public awareness of environmental issues.
