COMPREHENSION

1. The document was extracted from a British newspaper.
2. It is composed of letters or e-mails sent by readers.
3. Different people express their feelings about being allowed to smoke in eating places.

1. David Meredith's and Donna Lynde's letters were published on the same day.
Wrong. David Meredith's letter was published on September 22, Donna's letter on September 24
2. Donna Lynde lives in Britain.
Wrong. Donna Lynde lives in Newark in the US.
3. David Meredith criticizes smoke extraction systems in restaurants and bars.
Right. David says : "The British seem incapable of installing air extraction systems which work satisfactorily".
4. Donna Lynde doesn't agree with David Meredith.
Wrong. She writes : "David Meredith is right when he says....".
5. Linda Bates says smoking is forbidden in all Irish workplaces.
Right. Linda says : "We visited Ireland last May where they have banned smoking in all workplaces."
6. Donna would like people to be more tolerant about smoking.
Right. She writes "I do not believe that smokers should be made pariahs."

Donna has watering eyes and a burning nose when she is subjected to smoke.
4. Where was she surprised to find clean and fresh air?
She was surprised to find clean and fresh air in the smoking lounges of St Louis and Newark airports.
