Do U Spk Txt?

1 Sixty per cent of British secondary-school pupils have a mobile phone. And they don't just talk on them. Text messaging is the biggest craze since... mobile phones.

Text messages are short messages you send from one phone to another. They are often cheaper than normal calls, and you don't interrupt the person you are sending the message to. They can read it and reply when they want. You don't have problems with reception, or hearing a call in a party or disco, for example. And they're discreet – no one can listen to your conversation.

Text messages must be short – 160 characters maximum. It's difficult to type on a phone, so users have invented abbreviations they can type quickly. They don't type "you", but "U". "gr8" is "great". "spk" is "speak", etc.

Text messaging started becoming popular two years ago. By December 2002, phone companies think there will be 100 billion text messages a month: that's 15 messages for every person on the planet!

But what do people say in them? Christina, 15, from Copenhagen says, "I send about ten a day. I say things like 'C U 2morrow (see you



Tomorrow)' or 'sleep well'." And it is a popular way to ask someone out. But it's also a popular – and easy – way to end a romance!






